

Miramar College Fire Tech Professor Rides for Friend and Wounded Warriors

For the past 25 years, Dennis Sheean has been part of the Miramar College faculty teaching in the Fire Tech program. It wasn't until a few years ago that his neighbor, Kevin Childre, invited him to go cycling. Sheean was hooked and quickly joined Kevin's Navy cycling club. He then began riding alongside Kevin in support of EOD (Explosive Ordnance Disposal) Wounded Warriors. Childre was the Navy's senior EOD technician and at 53 years-old had just been promoted to commander of the EOD training program at Pt. Loma.

In May, while on a ride up California's Central Coast, Kevin lost control of his cycle and was killed.

Five months later, Sheean honored his friend and neighbor by completing a 200-mile charity bike ride to benefit EOD Wounded Warriors. Sheean was one of 65 San Diegans who started the journey on October 10th in Los Angeles and ended at Liberty Station the following day.

"When EOD warriors are wounded, they come back to the states to start their rehabilitation," said Sheean. "Sometimes it is difficult for their families to join them or

adapt due to costs, so that's where we come in. We do the fund raising annually, and turn those funds over to the national chapter and they disperse the funds as they see fit. The funds can provide anything from travel costs to modifications to houses and cars for service members who have prosthetics, and it can also go toward counseling.

This is the 5th consecutive year for the EOD Undefeated Wounded Warriors Ride. The 5-year plan was to raise \$500,000.00 in donations, but the crew has doubled its goal by raising over \$1 million.

Childre would be so proud.

MMTC Forms Special Committee to Discuss Future of Epicentre Building

November 1, 2015, marked the end of an era when the nonprofit social services agency, Harmonium, Inc., formally terminated its lease with the City of San Diego to manage the Epicentre, 8450 Mira Mesa Boulevard. Harmonium had operated the Epicentre as a teen center and all-ages music venue since 1999 in a city-owned building which was the original Mira Mesa Branch Library from 1977 to 1994. The Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch San Diego Police Storefront, also located in a portion of the former library building, is unaffected and continues operation as usual as the headquarters for the Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch Retired Senior Volunteer Patrol.

The former Epicentre space is now vacant. Its future use is the topic of discussion for a special committee of the Mira Mesa Town Council, Mira Mesa's non-profit civic group which holds monthly town hall meetings

on community issues and sponsors projects and programs to make the community a better place to live. Chaired by longtime Mira Mesa resident Bruce Brown, the Epicentre committee held its first meeting October 1, 2015, with city representatives as well as community volunteers in attendance. Bari Vaz is the secretary for the group. Bruce began by stating the purpose of the committee is to gather input from various portions of the community regarding future uses for the Epicentre building. He shared his vision of a multi-purpose Civic Center, Community Theater, youth/teen center and education center. The discussion then went around the room, and most expressed opinions that coincided with Bruce's stated idea. Planning how to realize the vision will require work at future meetings.

 - August 30, 2016: Timeline by Michael Crichton



As word spread October 16 about the passing of William "Bill" Male, retired Mira Mesa High School teacher, his former students and their parents, teaching colleagues, fellow Mira Mesa community volunteers and friends reacted with sadness but also shared fond memories and paid tribute to the lasting influence Bill had on so many lives.

"The world lost a wonderful person today. I met William "Bill" Male when I was a senior in high school. I was the class secretary, and he stepped in to be the class advisor. What I remember about Bill is that he was one of those teachers who never treated us like kids. He wanted us to think for ourselves and to question everything. That never changed over the years. He always believed I was capable of so much more than I thought I could do, and he made me want to be better," wrote Mylinh (Uy) Arnett, MMHS Class of 1993 and a William Male Foundation Board member, on her personal Facebook page.

Bill Male grew up in Los Angeles but called San Diego home for many years. He taught in San Diego schools in subjects ranging from English to psychology to video production. Bill's AP Psychology class was a favorite class and an inspiration for a number of students to major in psychology in college. Many students from his video production classes went on to successful careers in video. He also headed the Mira Mesa High School Diploma Program, an alternative education program, for ten years.

Bill was an active Mira Mesa community volunteer in the 1980s and 1990s. In 1985 he served as president of the Mira Mesa Town Council, Mira Mesa's non-profit civic group which sponsors projects to make the community a better place to live. For many years Bill volunteered on the Fourth of July personally videotaping the Mira Mesa Fourth of July Parade, interviewing parade watchers and participants as they marched the route, for a show that was later broadcast on community access television. Bill's dry wit made him the perfect emcee for community events

that called for a "roast," such as the August 1, 1994 Mira Mesa Town Council program celebrating the retirement of then MMHS principal Jim Vlassis (as reported in the Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch Sentinel, Mira Mesa's weekly newspaper until 2009.)

When Bill retired after teaching for 40 years, he continued to have an interest in helping young people to fulfill their passions and dreams. As a result, he founded the William Male Foundation to provide assistance to individuals in their creative pursuits. He wanted to focus specifically on the arts, because people who are interested in pursuing the arts don't always go to the university and don't often have a lot of scholarships and fellowships available to them. He wanted to give them a means to pursue that non-traditional path.

In addition to working with the William Male Foundation, Bill's interests in retirement have included photography, travel, going to the theater, art house films, and his dog Cindi.
