SDCCD Participation Model Summary:

Student award winners from each college's independent student art competition and student literary competition are juried at annual district level student art and student literary competitions for submission to the national student art competition and student literary competition.

Primary Components:

- Independent College Competitions; student awardees submitted to District Competitions
- District Competition Jury members from external art/literary community
- Rotating District Faculty Coordinators to lead District Competitions
- College Representatives provide college specific awardee information to District Competition via the Faculty Coordinator; participate in District Competition in an advisory role
- District Instructional Services provides administrative support
- Budget includes funding for District Faculty Coordinators and College Representatives

Participation model informed by other multi-college district participants in the League for Innovation in the Community Colleges, specifically, Maricopa Community Colleges, AZ. Recommended timeline informed by past timelines most recently utilized by host colleges and recommendations from the coordinator at the League.

Participation Model Details:

Independent College Competitions

- Each College independently manages its own college specific student competitions for both art and literary awards
- College student awardees are submitted to the District Competitions by the College Representative via the District Faculty Coordinators
- College Competition details and timelines are provided to the District Faculty Coordinators by the College Representative



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College Representatives

- Time commitment of 5 hours per annum
- Serve as primary liaison between College Competition and District Competition via the District Faculty Coordinator
 - College student awardees are submitted to the District Competition by the College Representative via the District Faculty Coordinator
 - College Competition details and timelines are provided to the District Faculty Coordinator by the College Representative
- Participate in the District Competition in an advisory role
- No regular meeting requirements

Rotating District Faculty Coordinators

- Two-year assignments via reassigned time equivalent to .20 FTEF per annum
- Renewable based on faculty interest
- Primary responsibilities include:
 - Collection of student award winners from each college via the College Representative
 - Selection and coordination of District Competition Jurors (from external art/literary community)
 - Primary contact for the League for Innovation Student Art/Literary Awards
 - Primary contact for College Representatives
 - Submission of final district award winners to the national competition

District Competition & Jurors

- Jury members will be representative of the external art/literary community
- Jurors will be publicized via a press release and receive letter of recognition
- Jurors will review College Competition awardees and select students to be submitted for the National Competition
- Review of student submissions may occur virtually; no formal face-to-face meetings required unless preferred by faculty coordinator and committee participants
- Jury process will be coordinated and led by the District Faculty Coordinator
- College Representatives will participate in an advisory role
- Students selected to move on to the national competition will be publicized via SDCCD's PR office



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Recommended Annual Timeline:

August/September:

- Confirm District Faculty Coordinators
 - 2017-2019 District Student Art Competition Faculty Coordinator: Wayne Hulgin, City College
 - 2017-2019 District Student Literary Competition Faculty Coordinator: TBD
- Confirm College Representatives

Fall Semester:

- November:
 - Final selection of Awardees from the College Competitions
 - Submit college competition awardees to Faculty Coordinator
- December:
 - Faculty Coordinator confirms District Competition Jurors

Spring Semester:

- February:
 - District Competition Jurors convened
- March:
 - District Competition winners submitted to National Competition
 - District Competition Jurors and student winners publicized
- May*:
 - National Competition Awardees announced
 - Publicize SDCCD winners (if applicable)
- Summer (July – August)*:
 - National Competition publication available
 - Publicize publication

*Confirmed dates for the National Student Art Competition and National Student Literary Competition are determined by the host institution. Host institution rotates annually. The 2017-2018 National Competition host institutions are:

- National Student Art Competition: Sinclair Community College, OH
- National Student Literary Competition: Central Piedmont Community College, NC
