Veterans Distribute Food

On a fall like Wednesday morning just three weeks before Veteran's Day, eight members of the Student Veterans Organization (SVO) gathered near the college pool. Their mission, distribute 70 meals to students undergoing food insecurities. "We received donations from Sprouts, Smart and Final, and a delivery from Feeding San Diego," said Christina Brown, Anthropology student at Miramar College. "I love helping out with food because I know it is a big insecurity and there's a lot of students who sleep in their cars and struggle on a day by day basis so they can get their education and I respect that."

Volunteers packed up bags of fruits and vegetables, cartons



of eggs, meats, canned goods and even Halloween treats. Students in need then drove through the roundabout near the pool to receive a bag full of groceries products. SVO volunteers loaded up cars, using COVID-19 safety protocols for contactless delivery, and off the students went.



Navy Veterans Jose Araujo and Amore Carchano attended the food distribution and found it to mirror their time in the service. "One of the reasons I joined (the SVO) was to be a part of something bigger," said Araujo. "This allows me to give back to the community, but more importantly it keeps me in touch with fellow Veterans." Something not overlooked by Araujo's fellow Navy Veteran Amore Carchano. "When you are getting out of the military it is a hard transition to a civilian life," said Carchano. "And having college friends who are also Veterans, you kind of get that feeling of acceptance, because it is really hard to adjust to civilian life."

Miramar College offers food distributions to its students once a week despite a pandemic which has forced most students, staff and faculty off campus the past 8 months. "Right now with Covid-19, there is a disconnection from the students," said Julia Kamp, mental health counselor at

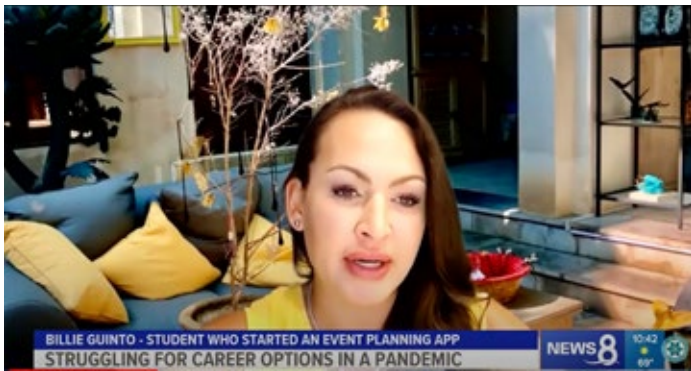

"We understand they are not always able to cover their basic needs and to be out there to provide a service for them is very important and just to let them know we are here is very important." Before joining Miramar College, Kamp spent 7 years at Marine Corp Station Miramar serving as a mental health counselor. She is also married to a Veteran of the Marine Corp.

Undocumented Student Week of Action took place virtually Oct. 19-24. The state-run initiative was executed locally by our Dreamers Support Services staff. Six days of workshops, for both students and faculty/staff, began with a student centric presentation on Why Entrepreneurship might be an option for you; Tips for Self-Care and Mental Health; Transfer 101; and What can Career Services do for a Dreamer Like Me?

For faculty and staff, the week began with a financial aid update from CCC. Other workshops included: Policy Updates with CCC; Undocu-Ally Training with Mesa; Equity Beyond Status; Building Institutional Infrastructure with CCC; Equitable Classroom Practices; Outreach in the Virtual Era, and it all concluded with a free Saturday Zoom-ba class.

Free Flu Shots

Our Student Health Services folks coordinated 4 days of free drive-by flu shot vaccinations. Students and staff had an opportunity to RSVP for one of four select dates. They were then asked to drive through the roundabout off Black Mountain Parkway at their allotted time to receive their vaccination. Forty-five students were vaccinated by our Health Services team over the first three sessions. Students remained in their cars, wore masks and received their shots through their car window. A 4th drive through event called "Boo to the Flu" took place on the evening of October 28 on campus.



Guided Pathways Retreat #2

The second Guided Pathways retreat was held Oct. 16. For 3 hours, there was a healthy discussion about all things Guided Pathways. GPS is using year two to continue to lay the foundational work for helping students succeed and the campus' voice offered insight and suggestions on how

best to achieve these. On October 16, faculty, staff and administrators from across Miramar College attended the GPS Design to Development Retreat. Part 2 in a series, this retreat followed up to the planning retreat from August 28. Whereas the first retreat helped the GPS team develop the anticipated outcomes for the 2020/2021 year, this retreat solicited input on activities that could help with the achievement of these anticipated outcomes. This year we will work on developing course sequences for degrees, onboarding students to interest areas and develop easy to navigate career exploration tools. Participants in both retreats have helped set the agenda for GPS, gave ideas on activities that could help accomplish these goals and established much needed work groups to engage more of the college.

Student Services Workshops

Student Services hosted a series of presentations in October specifically designed for our colleagues to learn more about remote student support services. These presentations provided an overview of various topics, how students can access remote services, and ways you can make referrals. A **Counseling Support Services** workshop was held Oct. 14 that provided an overview of general counseling, EOPS/CARE, Next Up, CalWORKS, DSPS, mental health and the San Diego Promise. **How to Help Students Prepare for Priority Registration** was held Oct. 21. **Paying for School** was held Oct. 28. All three presentation were held via zoom.

This was an opportunity to meet colleagues and ask questions you have about Miramar student support services. Student Services will offer more workshops in November.

FilipinX and LGBTQ History Months

Miramar College celebrated Filipinx American History Month by hosting a pair of speakers. Assembly member and San Diego Mayoral candidate Todd Gloria along with FANHS National Vice President Dr. Kevin Nadel both spoke via Zoom. Dr. Nadel is an activist, author and professor who has authored numerous publications on topics such as such: Filipino American Psychology, Microaggression, and LGBTQ history and law. Dr. Nadel is a professor at John Jay College of Criminal Justice in New York. Todd Gloria was San Diego's first interim mayor of Filipino ancestry when he took office in 2013-2014.

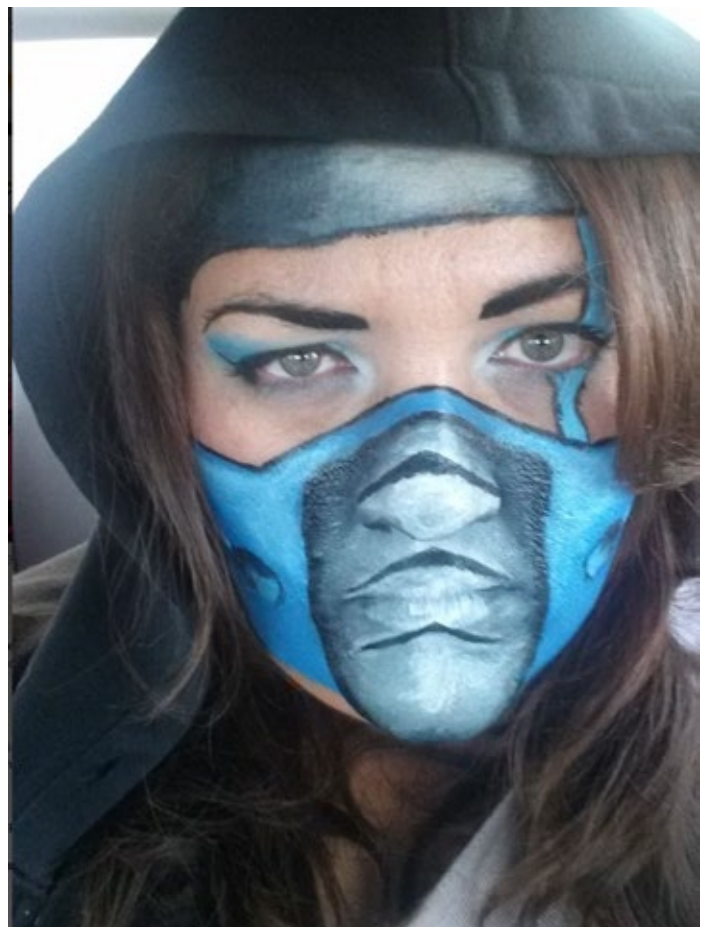
