**New Top Cop a Miramar Alumna**

Miramar alumna, former Assistant San Diego Police Chief Shelley Zimmerman was recently appointed the city's first-ever female Chief by new San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer and confirmed by the City Council, voting 8-0 on March 4. Zimmerman, attended the 13th Regional Academy at Miramar in 1982 and graduated in February 1983. She is a 31-year veteran with SDPD and has worked in several units during her career, including patrol as an officer and supervisor, internal affairs, the mayoral protection detail and narcotics. Zimmerman joins other proud Miramar alumni to have led SDPD as Chief -- Jerry Sanders (1993-1999), David Bejarano (1999-2003) and Interim Chief John Welter (2003). Chief Bill Kolender (1975-1988) graduated from the Academy prior to its permanent relocation at Miramar.





**California State Skills USA Competition to be Held in Miramar's New State-of-the-Art Diesel Facilities**

## Skilled Techs Compete for National Spot

Miramar College will host the diesel component of the *California State Skills USA* conference on Saturday, April 26, 2014. High school and post secondary student contestants will participate in competition that includes 12 stations, aligned with the stations of the national *Skills USA* competition -- engine component measuring, chassis identification, torque theory and fastener identification, failure analysis, preventive maintenance, axle differential, mobile hydraulics, electrical, job interview, live engine diagnostics, and air brakes. According to Gene Choe, Miramar diesel technology professor, with the addition of the new building and new equipment, an air conditioning diagnostic section has been added to the competition this year. The auto department, Hawthorne Machinery and EW Truck and Equipment will provide judging support. Students will have 30 minutes in each station, and, after eight hours, a winner will be determined in each category (high school, post secondary). Winners will be awarded prizes at their hotel conference room on April 27. It is hoped that the California representative will go on to win the national competition.

## SSSP Update

Last year, the State passed *Senate Bill 1456* and, as a result, Miramar received \$383,822 to augment matriculation activities. The amount is just slightly more than the total amount cut from our matriculation program over the last six years. *SB 1456* focuses on student success & support programs (SSSP) and will help more students to identify and complete their goals in an orderly and timely manner. It requires that every entering student be provided prescribed services including orientation, assessment and education planning services. Information on the SSSP plan was shared at the November 12, 2013 CEC meeting. College progress to date includes:

- Developed initial spending and activities plan and mapped proposed expenditures to campus and District strategic goals
- Made significant progress in developing education plans for students who have more than 45 units
- Received District approval to fill a new Dean of Matriculation & Student Development position
- Assigned Counselor Kirk Webley to provide faculty leadership and coordination of Freshman Year Experience (FYE) and Jump Start (will work collaboratively with instructional deans and faculty to structure an enhanced program)
- Counseling Department provided with additional adjunct support
- Transfer Center provided with additional faculty hourly support
- Approved recruitment of additional classified hourly staff to support FYE, Jump Start and the Counseling Office
- Established regular meeting schedule with Basic Skills Coordinator, Dean, School of Liberal Arts and the VPI
- Scheduled appointment an online orientation software program demonstration

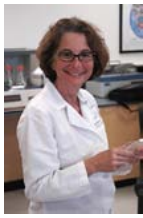
