VII. Other Business

- MATH 121/AB 1705 (Informational item)
- Removal of MATH 116 as a prerequisite from MATH 121, per CCCCO guidance and MATH Chairs recommendations
 - a. Due to AB 1705, MATH 116 will be removed as a prerequisite to MATH 121, which will happen administratively. Hence, the committee is asked to officially support this by law.
 - b. Wilborn shared that MATH 116 is one of the outcomes on the university course, which requires algebra topics to be taught in the course, so that piece will be taken care of by a new component. Hence, all 3 colleges are proposing to make a lab course to be coupled like the learning community courses, but MATH 121 will not require the lab.
 - c. MATH 116 is still required for certain students who are planning to transfer, so the messaging for this course is crucial. Due to limitations with AB 1705, we have to be really careful on the language. We cannot force the students to take the course. Yet, students will need to know the existing articulation based on their educational goal and who they are. Messaging may be "messy" and challenging.
 - d. Plan to spread the messaging about MATH 116 via Canvas, course catalog and syllabi.

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- a. Conversation about repeatability issue with work experience courses. Need to determine if repeated work experience is allowable to claim FTES.

XII. **Articulation Update**

- a. As a result of AB 928, which requires a single transfer GE pattern for students by Fall 2025, course proposed for transfer GE must be UC approved before they can get proposed for CalGETC.
- b. December 2023 is the last cycle to submit to two patterns against CSU. Courses or courses to transfer to GE will have to be proposed for UC as well, so now everyone will have to go through the same 2 years process of UC, then CSU.
- c. Courses on GE pattern will migrate to CalGETC. Existing courses such as COMS will be re-reviewed within a year, which faculty need to be aware of.

XIII. **CRC Chair Update**

- CurriOnet Meta
 - a. CurriQnet Meta is meant to be released at the beginning of the year. However, there are some glitches that need to be fixed. Hence, the release date and January meeting had to be postponed. The bugs are expected to be addressed by end of this week.
 - b. The District will host training sessions on CurriQunet Meta in-person and on Zoom on Fridays (TBD).
 - c. Old CurricUNET is still accessible online, but cannot do anything with it. Just viewing access only.
 - d. Need to focus on what is priority within CurriQnet for September launch time, particularly the window period for curriculum tech reviews. ADTs may be one of the highest priorities. The

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bachelor degree will also be a priority before launch time. Then, the respective programs outside the bachelor degree. Priorities will be relayed to the workgroup and determine other priorities need to be addressed.

- e. Dean S. Hess is also planning to hire a second Tech Writer Assistant or other form of assistance and funding to help us focus on our priorities.
- f. Easy transferability must be done by May.

• Program Viability Workgroup

- a. District Office will like a standardized tool to identify programs for board meeting purposes, and to provide to other colleges when a new program is created. They asked a reference tool from the workgroup through CIC.
- b. Miramar has a program viability policy already in place. Patricia Manley and her team really worked hard on our current policy.
- c. The proposed draft is to only complement the existing policy. The plan is to share the proposed draft to the Academic Senate Meeting on February 20th for review and gather feedback.
